Meeting Background / Proposal

The City of Toronto's Urban Design (City Planning) and Community Planning (Development Review) staff are conducting a Neighbourhood Character Study to clearly articulate the architectural and site character of the Cliffcrest Community (Scarborough Village up to Markham Road) and develop guidelines to inform future development, as directed by the adopted Council motion 2025.MM29.27, Preservation of Architectural Character in the Cliffcrest Community:
